Objective

Access to land as a central precondition for poverty reduction in rural areas has improved for certain population groups, especially for women and marginalized groups, in Central Uganda."

The project wants to foster

- the security of a long-term use right for the actual tenants on Mailo-Land to support investments
- the implementation of the Ugandan land law with regard to Mailo-Land
- the institutional framework will be strengthened through human capacity development in landrelated sections of district and sub-county administrations
- More effective procedures will be introduced with the help of user-friendly information and communication technology

Capacity Development Activities









- 1. Capacity Building of land managers and implementation partners in 8 sub-counties
 - on the legal provisions,
 - the processes for documenting land rights,
 - the project approach towards tenancy rights documentation
 - ADR and conflict resolution for land disputes
- 2. Capacity building of land inventory teams at District level
- 3. Training in GIS for management of tenancy rights
 - Cartographers and DLO staff
- 4. Equipment of subcounty
 - ALCs with PCs, safes, furniture, protective wear for field activities





Lessons Learned



- i. Involvement of charismatic champions at all levels
- ii. Giving an ear to land owners so they too can voice their grievances.
- iii. Avoidance of long time spans between field activities as this creates speculation and fear.
- iv. Continous engagement with partners i.e. MLHUD, district officials
- v. Emphasis on harmonious living/social cohesion than the 'punitive' legal framework
